### Teaching

Mark J. Cartledge, introduced the Flame of Love Project to undergraduate students taking the module: ‘Introduction to Pentecostalism’, academic year 2010/11. As a consequence, one undergraduate, Abigail Macallister, is conducting a dissertation project based on a visit to Iris Ministries in Mozambique (summer of 2011) and is using the Socialization sub-project as a basis for her study. She is a recipient of a University of Birmingham ‘Honey Pot’ award, which pays for her travel to Mozambique. The dissertation will be supervised by Cartledge and will be completed by February 2012.

#### Activities by your students or research assistants that have been influenced by the project

- Several of my university students have been influenced to organize a trip to Palestine to meet the people we interviewed and learn directly from them. They are raising funds for this trip that is planned for March 2012.
- At least two students have decided to do their public policy internships in the West Bank. These students are also helping organize advocacy initiatives, trademarking appropriate symbols, writing blogs and articles, and engaging in social media activism.
- One of my grad students translated a work by a South American exemplar into English and it is now in press (Dario Lopez Rodriguez, *The Liberating Mission of Jesus*, translated by Stefanie Israel, Eugene, OR: Wipf & Stock, 2011). Stefanie decided to focus her PhD in sociology at Notre Dame on global south justice in part because of exposure to the exemplars in this study and participation in this project.

### Works in progress

This summer I am beginning to adapt 200 pages of writing into three articles. The chapter drafts vary considerably in the extent to which further work is needed for them to appear as stand-alone essays.

(1) A first essay looks at reports of divine healing in connection with godly love theory. The conclusion of this first essay will be based on my presentation "Working the Angles," at the November 2010 Conference on the Great Commandment at Vanguard University. I plan to submit this first essay for publication during summer 2011.

(2) A second essay has the abbreviated working title, "After Toronto." I plan to write this second essay before the end of 2011, and it will draw extensively from my draft of the "History" chapter for the book with Brown. It will also draw on the research I am doing this summer for my contribution, "Charismatic Renewal and Neo-Pentecostalism: From American Origins to Global Permutations," in Cecil M. Robeck and Amos Yong, eds., *The Cambridge Companion to Pentecostalism* (Cambridge, UK: Cambridge University Press, 2012). I will complete the first draft of the essay for the *Cambridge Companion* by September 2011 and then turn back to the work already done on the Vineyard Movement, Toronto Revival, and the movements that emerged out of Toronto, and especially three that are of particular interest for FL--Randy Clark and Great Awakening, Heidi Baker and Iris Ministries, John and Carol Arnott, Catch the Fire Ministries, and the "soaking prayer" phenomenon. I am fascinated by the ways in which the Toronto Revival has spawned not one but several different models for Christian ministry. So the basic question is: Why? Why are there these multiple models, organizations, approaches, and how do these all relate back to "godly love." It might also be possible to draw in some sociological theory related to routinization and institutionalization. I will be situating the post-Toronto movements in the context of the larger, global situation in charismatic Christianity. Since Peter Althouse and Michael Wilkinson are planning to prepare their monograph on soaking prayer in the coming month, I might ask for their permission this fall to draw on and cite some of their forthcoming work in the section of the second essay dealing with the Arnotts and "soaking prayer." This would provide a nice way of linking of the Brown-McClymond collaboration with the Althouse-Wilkinson collaboration.

(3) The third essay I plan to write will involve a good deal of new research and writing. This is a wide-angle overview of divine healing ideas and practices from a historical standpoint. It would not stand alone as journal article, and yet it raises an interesting question about the ancient versus contemporary growth of Christianity as fueled by divine healing. In a nutshell, I would like to write on the similarities and differences between divine healing practices in the early church as compared with the twentieth-century church. This will require me to do a lot of reading on early Christianity, and some consulting with colleagues at my university who teach in the field of early Christianity. My essay on "Mission and Evangelism" in Gerald R. McDermott, ed., *The Oxford Handbook to Evangelical Theology* (Oxford 2010), contains some brief remarks on healing in early Christianity. Yet I am not aware of any substantial studies that link the

2nd-3rd centuries with the 20th century. This essay is going to take longer to produce, and I would not expect to have that done until later on in 2012.

In 2010 I gave guest lectures at Central Presbyterian Church (Clayton, MO), and Anglican Church of the Resurrection (Chesterfield, MO) that summarized on a popular level the Flame of Love research done in Mozambique and Brazil.

### Media

The idea I pitched to *Christianity Today* magazine during a lunch meeting with their Managing Editor, Mark Galli, has been accepted. I spoke with Galli about the possibilities of a feature in the magazine on Heidi Baker that would touch on her adventurous life, the church growth taking place in Mozambique, the reports of divine healing, the medical journal article (STEPP essay) by Brown-McClymond, and Margaret Poloma's interviews with Baker and investigation of Baker as an exemplar of "godly love." I recently got an email from Tim Stafford, who is one of the leading writers for *Christianity Today*, and he is indicating now that he plans to travel to see Iris Ministries in Mozambique. I have supplied him with some basic information on Heidi Baker, a copy of the STEPP essay, suggestions for possible "angles" to take on the story, and Margaret's email address. *Christianity Today* has 500,000 paid subscribers, and it is something like the *New York Times* of evangelicalism. Many church leaders in North America and around the world read it to keep up. As always with a media feature, it is impossible to know in advance exactly what sort of story will emerge, but I am heartened at the thought that Stafford is not going to write this story from an armchair but that he plans to visit Mozambique. I strongly urged him to contact Margaret Poloma, and I explained the link between Baker and the Flame of Love Research Project, and the divine healing investigation. My sense is that the FL link may have helped to lift this story in terms of newsworthiness. I would be surprised if the news feature were not to mention this. I apprised Stafford regarding Margaret's multiple interviews with Baker, and the videotaped conversation with Heidi last December. So it is possible that Stafford may ask for access to some of that material.

### **Donald E. Miller and Dick Flory**

Our book in progress on the Dream Center movement, listed below, deserves some additional comment. Matthew Barnett (founder of the Dream Center) has offered his film crew and studio to tape interviews so that the book will have a DVD of first-hand testimonies as well as other documentation of the Dream Center. The Dream

Center now has 120 affiliates and the entrepreneurs of these "daughter" movements regularly speak at the Thursday night service, which gives us a chance to do video interviews with them during the upcoming months. Incidentally, Matt confirmed that no one has written an academic book on the Dream Center.
